

Harmony Locations User Guide



Overview


The Locations application is a new and revamped version of the old “My Locations” app. With a new streamlined design that matches the new modern v6 look and a powerful HTML5 technology under the hood, now the user can easily manage locations, opening hours and for the first time, create and customize groups of sites.

The application’s layout is divided into two main zones:

- On the left side is the **Sites** panel that shows all the available sites from the current workgroup
- On the right side three tabs are nested:
 - General tab: the user can make changes to the selected site
 - Opening hours: the user can set the opening hours for the selected site
 - Group of sites: I can create groups that can nest multiple site

10.1 The “Sites” panel

As its name suggests, in the “Sites” panel the user will see all the available sites from his workgroup.



The “Sites” panel has five main options:

- Show/hide the sites that belong to child workgroups
- Reload the entire list of sites
- Search for a site
- Filter by a group (only display the sites that belong to a particular group)
- Show the hardware available in the selected site

10.2 The “General” tab

Once a site has been selected, its properties will automatically be populated in the “General” tab.


The “General” tab

From the “General” tab the user can change the address or the timezone of the selected workgroup. Please note that the “Client Site ID” and “Mood Site ID” are recommended to only be changed by a Mood technician.

Once a change has been made, it can be saved by clicking on the “Save” button or it can be dismissed by clicking on the “Cancel” button. Both are located on the right side of the panel.

10.3 The “Opening Hours” tab


In the “Opening Hours” tab the user can define the interval when players will run on the selected site.

There are multiple ways of creating an opening hour interval:

1. Simply by clicking anywhere on the schedule zone, a dialog will open and the user can define the start day, start time, end day, end time




Schedule dialog

2. If a slot has already been added, the user can simply move it anywhere on the schedule zone by drag and drop

3. If a slot must be increased or decreased, the user can either click on it (and the schedule dialog will open) or resize it as needed, simply by grabbing its top or bottom margin and then move it up or down

Once a time slot has been added, it will look as follows:




Time slot in the opening hours

If the user wants to remove a slot, he can click on the "x" button located in the top right corner of the slot.

In order to save the changes, the user must click on the "Save" button situated on the top right corner of the "Opening Hours" tab. Likewise, if the changes must be discarded, the user must click on the "Cancel" button situated in the same location.

10.4 The “Group of sites” tab

In this tab, the user can organize the sites from his workgroup into groups. The main purpose of a group is that it makes the addressing of content in MVision Advanced an easier process. Managing addressing permissions for a single group instead of dozens of sites takes considerably less time.




“Groups of sites” tab


Working with groups is omnidirectional:

1. If the user clicks on a site, all the groups will be selectable using checkboxes and all the groups that contain the site will be checked. This approach is suitable when the user wants to add the site to multiple groups at once.
2. If the user clicks on a group, all the sites will be selectable using checkboxes and all the sites from the group will be checked. This approach is suitable when the user wants to add multiple sites at once in the group.


In the example below, the user has selected a site and added it to multiple groups:



In the example below, the user has selected a group and added the site in it:



In order to create a group, the user must click the "Add new group" button:



Furthermore, the groups can be deleted or renamed using the function buttons located on each line:
